Climate

Mostly temperate, the south - has a Mediterranean climate

Biomes: tundra in the North, Mediterranean forest in the south, steppes to the South-East and temperate forest in the central

band.

Mountains: Pyrenees and the Alps in the south, and the Urals to the east. Highest: Mount Elbrus in the Russian Urals. Mont Blanc French/ Italian border

Coast lines: Arctic Ocean in the north, the Atlantic to the west, and the Mediterranean and the Black Sea to the south.

Major rivers: the Volga, Danube, Ural, Dnieper and Don

Major Landmarks: Houses of Parliament (London), Eiffel Tower (Paris), Colosseum (Rome), Learning Tower (Pisa) Brandenburg Gate (Berlin)
