

Biome	Biomes are very large ecological areas, with fauna and flora (animals and plants) adapting to their environment			
Canyon	a deep, narrow valley with steep sides. long term weather patterns in an area.			
Climate	a landform that forms at the mouth of a river,			
Drought	less rainfall than is expected over an extended period of time, resulting in a water shortage			
Erosion	the act in which rock/soil is worn away, often by water, wind or ice.			
Grand Canyon	the large canyon made by the Colorado River in the USA State of Arizona.			
Lake	a body of water surrounded by land.			
Latitude	a measure of the distance you are located from the equator.			
Native Americans	a member of any of the indigenous peoples of North America			
Population Distribution	the share of inhabitants by types of regions in a given country			
Population Density	population divided by land area in square kilometres
