A colony is a piece of land that another country has taken over and rules.

The Commonwealth is a group of 54 independent countries who joined together to promote peace, prosperity and democracy. Almost all of them are former British colonies and the Queen is the head of the Commonwealth. It began in 1931.

If you are demobbed you are released from your service in the military, when a war ends many men and women are 'demobbed'.

Treating someone unjustly because of a characteristic they have, e.g. gender, race, age, a disability.

When a country has a lot of colonies it is called an Empire.

This is when you move permanently to another country.

Mother Country plantation	Indigenous or native peoples are the people who are living in a country originally. Someone who moves to a new place to find work or better living conditions.
racism	In an empire the mother country is the country that rules (e.g. Britain, Spain, Portugal, France etc)
Transatlantic Slave Trade	Large farms that grow crops such as sugar and tobacco.
	Treating people differently or believing they are different because of their race/ colour of their skin.
	In the 1600s African people were taken against their will across the Atlantic. They were bought and sold as slaves and made to work in the European plantations.
